Dear Residents and Families,

I wanted to communicate with you today about an important matter and to ask you for your prayers.

Yesterday, we learned that one of our Assisted Lifestyle residents has tested positive for COVID-19. This resident was asymptomatic and was identified through our universal testing. While this is unfortunate news, it is something that we knew could happen and that we have planned for and trained for.

To our knowledge, no one is displaying symptoms of COVID-19. The universal testing did not identify any other positive residents or co-workers. Based on this, the representative from the Department of Health indicated there is a strong possibility that this is a false positive. Even with that presumption, we have implemented all precautions, including isolating the resident and the unit.

For our residents, we ask you to continue to pay attention to yourself, to how you feel, and to report to the staff any indications that you may be becoming ill. If you believe you have had contact with anyone with symptoms or who has reported they are positive for COVID-19, please let us know.

We feel confident that we are doing everything we can to keep you and your loved ones safe. At this time, our Assisted Lifestyle residents will be provided in-room dining and activities to enhance safety measures.

I thank you for all that you have done to help us keep everyone safe. Social distancing, wearing face masks, vigorously washing and sanitizing hands, and staying separated from family, have all been a tremendous help.

We will continue to keep you updated if and when other events occur.
